Re: 2024.05.06 City Secretary Monthly Report

Citizens: Numerous calls and visits assisting eclipse party attendees and vendors, municipal court participants, and Unite Ellis County endeavors. Research and respond to water meter reading and leak dispute.

Public Information Requests: Fulfilled or contacted attorney for requests regarding water bills, solid waste contract (is this information proprietary?) city attorney has requested AG opinion, personnel policy, employee names and emails addresses (no response to my reply asking what information will be used for), traffic offenses, and financial reports.

Projects: Exploring options for live streaming of council meetings one potential solution on tonight's agenda, updating specific use permits, Wilemon Park signs are here and ready to be installed, employee handbook revisions are underway, researching landscapers (Wilemon Park trees and stagnant water), playground equipment manufacturers, vehicle purchase or replacement grants.

Budget: Amendment approved, still working to make QuickBooks agree with approved budget, met with many finance officials and vendors at GFOAT. These professionals highly recommend we engage with a bookkeeper who specializes in government accounting. I am still a TML financial bootcamp candidate meanwhile researching accounting firms and gathering pricing for council consideration. Laurie Montanez continues work as budget point person and is reviewing transactions.

Events: Mayor and Chief approved event plans for Cares for Cole Car Show and Friends of Maypearl Car Show, both plans returned to organizer, city employees and fire chief.

Streets and Potholes: Public Works filled potholes using entire supply of asphalt, request for another pallet on agenda, request denied, complaints continue. New request for another pallet on tonight's agenda.

Contracts: Updated MOU with MISD signed and returned, only change was chief.

SOS: State Energy Conservation Office- nothing new to report.

2022 TxCDBG: Met with engineer, plan is to begin work June 1, continue to meet administrative obligations, ie posting requirements. Two new requirements on tonight's agenda.

Buzzards: Working with city attorney now due to no response from USDA and threat of being sued. Received word our contact with USDA has left employment, await response from his replacement. PD is now involved as it could potentially be an ordinance violation.

STRs: visited with firm out of Louisiana at GFOAT, they highly recommend establishing a policy/ordinance sooner rather than later.

Water loss date 08/03/2023: First payment arrived late and was returned due to insufficient funds, emailed owner. No response. Will check with Nicole on whether we should file civil lawsuit or criminal charges.

Municipal Court: Pretrial docket held April 11, 2024, prosecutor dismissed many cases for compliance, other cases postponed due to absence of bailiff (Judge Boston unable to take bench in his absence). Monthly reporting to be submitted to State of Texas, Office of Court Administration, and Department of Public Safety.

Public Works: One additional RFQ received for WUTAP project, await scoresheets from Mayor and Colton to select then present to council for vote.

Boards: Both MEDC Boards to meet 05/09/2024, 05/20/2024 special session for P&Z to consider SUP application from Hard 90, publication done, notices mailed. Item to be considered by council at 06/03/2024 meeting.

Ordinance Violations: Potential violations at cell phone tower (buzzards).

Bills: See packet.

Delinquent Bills: None.

Bank Balances: See packet.

Employee Relations: John Thacker was appointed interim police chief. John Shelton accepted offer and took office as chief of police 05/01/2024.

Audit: Attended GFOAT conference in Round Rock on scholarship. As previously stated, it is highly recommended that the city engages with a bookkeeper who specializes in government accounting. Laurie Montanez has been granted access to QuickBooks in the meantime.

Elections: Canvass to be scheduled.

Chief Shelton and I met Councilman Baker at the Ellis County Convene where we connected with local leaders to learn about resources for our citizens in need. Resources are being posted on the city's website and social media.

CODE OF CONDUCT POLICY

These procedures are intended to serve as guidelines for the procurement of supplies, equipment, construction services and professional services for the Texas Community Development Block Grant (TxCDBG) Program. The regulations related to conflict of interest and nepotism may be found at the Texas Government Code Chapter 573, Texas Local Government Code Chapter 171, Uniform Grant Management Standards by Texas Comptroller, 24 CFR 570.489(g) & (h), and 2 CFR 200.318.

CODE OF CONDUCT

As a Grant Recipient of a TxCDBG contract, the City of Maypearl, Texas shall avoid, neutralize or mitigate actual or potential conflicts of interest so as to prevent an unfair competitive advantage or the existence of conflicting roles that might impair the performance of the TxCDBG contract or impact the integrity of the procurement process.

For procurement of goods and services, no employee, officer, or agent of the City of Maypearl shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by TxCDBG funds if he or she has a real or apparent conflict of interest. Such a conflict could arise if the employee, officer or agent; any member of his/her immediate family; his/her partner; or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of the parties indicated herein, has a financial or other interest in or a tangible personal benefit from a firm considered for a contract.

No officer, employee, or agent of the City of Maypearl shall solicit or accept gratuities, favors or anything of monetary value from contractors or firms, potential contractors or firms, or parties to sub-agreements, except where the financial interest is not substantial or the gift is an unsolicited item of nominal intrinsic value.

Contractors that develop or draft specifications, requirements, statements of work, or invitations for bids or requests for proposals must be excluded from competing for such procurements.

For all other cases, no employee, agent, consultant, officer, or elected or appointed official of the state, or of a unit of general local government, or of any designated public agencies, or subrecipients which are receiving TxCDBG funds, that has any CDBG function/responsibility, or is in a position to participate in a decision-making process or gain inside information, may obtain a financial interest or benefit from the TxCDBG activity.

The conflict of interest restrictions and procurement requirements identified herein shall apply to a benefitting business, utility provider, or other third party entity that is receiving assistance, directly or indirectly, under a TxCDBG contract or award, or that is required to complete some or all work under the TxCDBG contract in order to meet the National Program Objective.



Any person or entity including any benefitting business, utility provider, or other third party entity that is receiving assistance, directly or indirectly, under a TxCDBG contract or award, or that is required to complete some or all work under the TxCDBG contract in order to meet a National Program Objective, that might potentially receive benefits from TxCDBG awards may not participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by CDBG funding.

Any alleged violations of these standards of conduct shall be referred to the City of Maypearl Attorney. Where violations appear to have occurred, the offending employee, officer or agent shall be subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to dismissal or transfer; where violations or infractions appear to be substantial in nature, the matter may be referred to the appropriate officials for criminal investigation and possible prosecution.

Section 504 Policy Against Discrimination based on Handicap and Grievance Procedures

In accordance with 24 CFR Section 8, Nondiscrimination based on Handicap in federally assisted programs and activities of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 794), and Section 109 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended (42 U.S.C. 5309), the City of Maypearl hereby adopts the following policy and grievance procedures:

1. <u>Discrimination prohibited.</u> No otherwise qualified individual with handicaps in the United States shall, solely by reason of his or her handicap, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

2. The City of Maypearl does not discriminate on the basis of handicap in admission or access to, or treatment or employment in, its federally assisted programs and activities.

3. The City of Maypearl's recruitment materials or publications shall include a statement of this policy in 1. above.

4. The City of Maypearl shall take continuing steps to notify participants, beneficiaries, applicants and employees, including those with impaired vision or hearing, and unions or professional organizations holding collective bargaining or professional agreements with the recipients that it does not discriminate on the basis of handicap in violation of 24 CFR Part 8.

5. For hearing and visually impaired individuals eligible to be served or likely to be affected by the TxCDBG program, the City of Maypearl shall ensure that they are provided with the information necessary to understand and participate in the TxCDBG program.

6. <u>Grievances and Complaints</u>

a. Any person who believes she or he has been subjected to discrimination on the basis of disability may file a grievance under this procedure. It is against the law for the City of Maypearl to retaliate against anyone who files a grievance or cooperates in the investigation of a grievance.

- b. Complaints should be addressed to: City of Maypearl Mayor, 104 E 2nd Street, Maypearl, TX 76064, 972-435-2380, who has been designated to coordinate Section 504 compliance efforts.
- c. A complaint should be filed in writing or verbally, contain the name and address of the person filing it, and briefly describe the alleged violation of the regulations.
- d. A complaint should be filed within thirty (30) <u>working</u> days after the complainant becomes aware of the alleged violation.
- e. An investigation, as may be appropriate, shall follow a filing of a complaint. The investigation will be conducted by the Mayor. Informal but thorough investigations will afford all interested persons and their representatives, if any, an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to a complaint.
- f. A written determination as to the validity of the complaint and description of resolution, if any, shall be issued by the Mayor, and a copy forwarded to the complainant with fifteen (15) <u>working</u> days after the filing of the complaint where practicable.
- g. The Section 504 coordinator shall maintain the files and records of the City of Maypearl relating to the complaints files.
- h. The complainant can request a reconsideration of the case in instances where he or she is dissatisfied with the determination/resolution as described in f. above. The request for reconsideration should be made to the City of Maypearl within ten working days after the receipt of the written determination/resolution.
- i. The right of a person to a prompt and equitable resolution of the complaint filed hereunder shall not be impaired by the person's pursuit of other remedies such as the filing of a Section 504 complaint with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Utilization of this grievance procedure is not a prerequisite to the pursuit of other remedies.
- j. These procedures shall be construed to protect the substantive rights of interested persons, to meet appropriate due process standards and assure that the City of Maypearl complies with Section 504 and HUD regulations.

THE CITY OF MAYPEARL CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PLAN TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

Note to Grant Recipients regarding Limited English Proficiency (LEP) requirements:

In accordance with federal law, if there is a significant number of the population who are non-English speaking residents and are affected by the TxCDBG project, such citizens should have 'meaningful access' to all aspects of the TxCDBG project. To provide 'meaningful access', Grant Recipients may need to provide interpreter services at public hearings or provide non-English written materials that are routinely provided in English. COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

These complaint procedures comply with the requirements of the Texas Department of Agriculture's Texas Community Development Block Grant (TxCDBG) Program and Local Government Requirements found in 24 CFR §570.486 (Code of Federal Regulations). Citizens can obtain a copy of these procedures at the City of Maypearl City Hall, 104 E 2nd Street, Maypearl, TX 76064, 972-435-2380, during regular business hours.

Below are the formal complaint and grievance procedures regarding the services provided under the TxCDBG project.

- A person who has a complaint or grievance about any services or activities with respect to the TxCDBG project, whether it is a proposed, ongoing, or completed TxCDBG project, may during regular business hours submit such complaint or grievance, in writing to the Mayor at 104 E 2nd Street, Maypearl, TX 76064, or may call 972-435-2380.
- 2. A copy of the complaint or grievance shall be transmitted by the Mayor to the entity that is the subject of the complaint or grievance and to the City Attorney within five (5) working days after the date of the complaint or grievance was received.
- 3. The Mayor shall complete an investigation of the complaint or grievance, if practicable, and provide a timely written answer to person who made the complaint or grievance within ten (10) days.
- 4. If the investigation cannot be completed within ten (10) working days per 3 above, the person who made the grievance or complaint shall be notified, in writing, within fifteen (15) days where practicable after receipt of the original complaint or grievance and shall detail when the investigation should be completed.
- 5. If necessary, the grievance and a written copy of the subsequent investigation shall be forwarded to the TxCDBG for their further review and comment.

6. If appropriate, provide copies of grievance procedures and responses to grievances in both English and Spanish, or other appropriate language.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

When requested, the City shall provide technical assistance to groups that are representative of persons of low- and moderate-income in developing proposals for the use of TxCDBG funds. The City, based upon the specific needs of the community's residents at the time of the request, shall determine the level and type of assistance.

PUBLIC HEARING PROVISIONS

For each public hearing scheduled and conducted by the City, the following public hearing provisions shall be observed:

- 1. Public notice of all hearings must be published at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to the scheduled hearing. Each public notice must include the date, time, location and topics to be considered at the public hearing. The public notice may be given in one of three ways:
 - a. Publish the notice in a newspaper of general circulation;
 - b. Post the notice in at least two public places accessible to the general public at the time of the posting including City Hall and a location within the target area (if applicable); OR
 - c. Post the notice in one public place accessible to the general public at the time of the posing, such as City Hall, **and** post on the City's website.
- 2. When a significant number of non-English speaking residents are a part of the potential service area of the TxCDBG project, vital documents such as notices should be published in the predominant language of these non-English speaking citizens.
- 3. Each public hearing shall be held at a time and location convenient to potential or actual beneficiaries and will include accommodation for persons with disabilities. Persons with disabilities must be able to attend the hearings and the City must make arrangements for individuals who require auxiliary aids or services if contacted at least two days prior to the hearing.
- 4. A public hearing held prior to the submission of a TxCDBG application must be held after 5:00 PM on a weekday or at a convenient time on a Saturday or Sunday.
- 5. When a significant number of non-English speaking residents can be reasonably expected to participate in a public hearing, an interpreter should be present to accommodate the needs of the non-English speaking residents.

The City shall comply with the following citizen participation requirements for the preparation and submission of an application for a TxCDBG project:

1. At a minimum, the City shall hold at least one (1) public hearing to prior to submitting the application to the Texas Department of Agriculture.

- 2. The City shall retain documentation of the hearing notice(s), a listing of persons attending the hearing(s), minutes of the hearing(s), and any other records concerning the proposed use of funds for three (3) years from closeout of the grant to the state. Such records shall be made available to the public in accordance with Chapter 552, Texas Government Code.
- 3. The public hearing shall include a discussion with citizens as outlined in the applicable TxCDBG application manual to include, but is not limited to, the development of housing and community development needs, the amount of funding available, all eligible activities under the TxCDBG program, and the use of past TxCDBG contract funds, if applicable. Citizens, with particular emphasis on persons of low- and moderate-income who are residents of slum and blight areas, shall be encouraged to submit their views and proposals regarding community development and housing needs. Citizens shall be made aware of the location where they may submit their views and proposals should they be unable to attend the public hearing.
- 4. When a significant number of non-English speaking residents can be reasonably expected to participate in a public hearing, an interpreter should be present to accommodate the needs of the non-English speaking residents.

The City must comply with the following citizen participation requirements in the event that the City receives funds from the TxCDBG program:

- The City shall also hold a public hearing concerning any substantial change, as determined by TxCDBG, proposed to be made in the use of TxCDBG funds from one eligible activity to another again using the preceding notice requirements.
- 2. Upon completion of the TxCDBG project, the City shall hold a public hearing and review its program performance including the actual use of the TxCDBG funds.
- 3. When a significant number of non-English speaking residents can be reasonably expected to participate in a public hearing, for either a public hearing concerning substantial change to the TxCDBG project or for the closeout of the TxCDBG project, publish notice in both English and Spanish, or other appropriate language and provide an interpreter at the hearing to accommodate the needs of the non-English speaking residents.
- 4. The City shall retain documentation of the TxCDBG project, including hearing notice(s), a listing of persons attending the hearing(s), minutes of the hearing(s), and any other records concerning the actual use of funds for a period of three (3) years from closeout of the grant to the state. Such records shall be made available to the public in accordance with Chapter 552, Texas Government Code.

- 5. Si es necesario, la queja y una copia escrita de la investigación posterior se remitirán a la TxCDBG para su posterior revisión y comentarios.
- 6. Se proporcionara copias de los procedimientos de queja y las respuestas a las quejas, tanto en Inglés y Español, u otro lenguaje apropiado.

ASISTENCIA TÉCNICA



Whereas, the City of Maypearl, Texas, (hereinafter referred to as "City of Maypearl") has been awarded TxCDBG funding through a TxCDBG grant CDV23-0461 from the Texas Department of Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as "TDA");

Whereas, the City of Maypearl, in accordance with Section 109 of the Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act. (24 CFR 6); the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. 6101-6107); and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and for construction contracts greater than \$10,000, must take actions to ensure that no person or group is denied benefits such as employment, training, housing, and contracts generated by the CDBG activity, on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or disability;

Whereas, the City of Maypearl, in consideration for the receipt and acceptance of federal funding, agrees to comply with all federal rules and regulations including those rules and regulations governing citizen participation and civil rights protections;

Whereas, the City of Maypearl, in accordance with Section 104(1) of the Housing and Community Development Act, as amended, and State's certification requirements at 24 CFR 91.325(b)(6), must adopt an excessive force policy that prohibits the use of excessive force against non-violent civil rights demonstrations;

Whereas, the City of Maypearl, in accordance with Executive Order 13166, must take reasonable steps to ensure meaningful access to services in federally assisted programs and activities by persons with limited English proficiency (LEP) and must have an LEP plan in place specific to the locality and beneficiaries for each TxCDBG project;

Whereas, the City of Maypearl, in accordance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, does not discriminate on the basis of disability and agrees to ensure that qualified individuals with disabilities have access to programs and activities that receive federal funds; and

Whereas, the City of Maypearl, in accordance with Section 808(e)(5) of the Fair Housing Act (42 USC 3608(e)(5)) that requires HUD programs and activities be administered in a manner affirmatively to



further the policies of the Fair Housing Act, agrees to conduct at least one activity during the contract period of the TxCDBG contract, to affirmatively further fair housing;

- 6. Section 3 economic opportunity;
- 7. Limited English Proficiency; and
- 8. Activity to affirmatively Furth Fair Housing choice.
